PREMIUMS

You must fill out and return a current W-9 form in order to receive your premium check.

The Entry office will process judging results as quickly as possible after completion of judging. Notice will be posted in departments when premium checks are processed and ready in the Entry Office. The **Entry Office** will be open from **July 27th through August 4^h (8am to 6pm) and August 5th through 9th (9am to 4pm)**. Every effort should be made to collect your Premium Checks between these times. Premium Checks in the amount of \$399.99 or less may be cashed during these times in the Entry Office.

All remaining Premium Checks will be mailed to you in the name and at the address provided by you on the W-9 form.

EXHIBITOR PASSES & OFFICE FEES

Each exhibitor must purchase one EXHIBITOR'S PACKET (\$20). Additional free passes will be issued for every \$50.00 of entry money sent in. Jr live and open entry fees will be a combined total to qualify for additional passes.

Exhibitors must pay the \$10 office fee for each department entered (Open Beef & Jr. Livestock are two separate departments).

RULES & REGULATIONS

1. All participants at Montana State Fair events are responsible for reading the Montana State Fair GENERAL INFORMATION Section and complying with policies listed therein. This section is located at goexpopark.com under the Montana State Fair tab.
2. AGREEMENT TO ALL RULES AND REGULATIONS HEREIN STATED IS UNDERSTOOD WHEN THE EXHIBITOR SUBMITS THE ENTRY FORM. EXHIBITORS WILL COMPLY WITH IAFE NATIONAL CODE OF SHOW RING ETHICS.
3. **ALL ENTRANTS MUST COMPLETE A W9 FORM AT TIME OF ENTRY TO RECEIVE ANY PREMIUMS.**
4. **Junior Livestock exhibitors must purchase an Exhibitor's Packet for \$20** good for 10 admissions for Fair week. With purchase of first Exhibitor's Packet, additional free passes are issued for every \$50.00 of entry fees. Junior livestock entries and open livestock entries for an individual exhibitor will be a combined total to qualify for additional passes. Exhibitors may purchase individual tickets for \$4.00 each.
5. **Exhibitors must pay the \$10 office fee for each department entered** (Open Beef is one department & Jr. Live is another department).
6. **ENTRY DEADLINE: JULY 7, 2018.** No entry will be considered complete unless accompanied by the appropriate entry fees. Late entries are subject to double entry fees on a space available basis. **NO LATE ENTRIES ACCEPTED AFTER JULY 15, 2018.**
7. If entries warrant, classes may be divided or combined at the discretion of Montana State Fair management.
8. All animals are required to have health and brand inspections in order to show and/or sell. These papers will be checked at each species appointed check-in. Health papers must be issued within 30 days from the start of Montana State Fair. Certificate must accompany the animal upon arrival and be available for examination for the duration show.
9. Animals will be stalled in the Livestock Pavilion. First bedding will be provided. Additional bedding will be available for purchase.
10. **All cattle are required to be stalled in the Livestock Pavilion from 11 a.m. to 7 p.m. each day until release.**
11. No fees are charged for fitting chutes or tie outs. This privilege is allowed in designated areas only. Chutes will not be allowed in the aisles.
12. No floor standing fans will be permitted in the aisles. Fans may be hung from exhibitor provided frames but electrical service is limited.
13. Show numbers will be assigned per head and exhibitors are required to wear the assigned number at all times the individual animal is being judged.
14. Montana youth who are current members of 4-H, FFA or junior breed associations are eligible to enter market animals. Heifer exhibitors must also be current members of 4-H, FFA or junior breed associations but can be out of state residents.
15. There is no limit on the number of animals an exhibitor may enter and show. However, the exhibitor must show their own animal unless they have more than one in a class. Then the exhibitor may have another junior livestock exhibitor show for them.
16. Market animals will be ranked based on visual evaluation of market-ready quality.
17. Animals that have been previously **EXHIBITED AND SOLD** at any 2018 Montana fair are eligible to show in the 2018 Montana State Fair. The animal must have been shown and sold by the exhibitor listed on the entry. Said animal may show and is eligible for all prizes but CANNOT SELL in the Livestock Sale. A release form will be required for any animal entered that has been previously sold. **These forms are available from the Junior Livestock Superintendent and must be turned in at check-in.**
18. Show is non-terminal. Champions and Reserve Champions will not be required to sell but management asks that exhibitors seriously consider this option. Floor price is the responsibility of the seller.

HEIFER SHOW (DIVISIONS 1-13)

REGULATIONS:

1. **Heifer must be owned by exhibitor by June 15 of the current year.**
2. Original registration papers must be available at check-in. National breed association rules will govern age and ownership requirements of each breed division.
3. Heifers will be shown according to age within breed divisions (youngest to oldest). Larger classes may be broken at the discretion of show management.
4. **If a breed division fails to be represented by three head, that breed will transfer into the Registered Other Breeds division.**
5. Registered heifers of a breed division not listed will be shown in the Registered Other Breed heifer classes. If three or more heifers of a breed not listed are entered, a separate breed division may be considered.
6. All cattle must be halter broke and manageable.

DIVISION 14: MARKET STEER

REGULATIONS:

1. **All steers shown must have been born between January 1 and May 31, 2017.**
2. **Ownership date for steers is January 1 of current year. (see rule #17)**
3. **Minimum show/sale weight is 1100 pounds** and maximum sale weight for market steers is 1,450 pounds. Steers weighing over will sell at 1,450 weight.
4. Steers classes will be broken according to check-in weight regardless of breed. Steers will show lightest to heaviest and class breaks will be posted prior to show. The weights will be available to the judge.

5. Montana State Fair reserves the right to weigh back any steer immediately following exhibition. A variance of less than five percent difference from the weigh-in weight is recommended. A variance of more than five percent may result in disqualification.
6. Montana State Fair reserves the right to collect saliva, urine, blood sample, etc on any animal for testing of forbidden drugs or medication.

JL-14-1 Market Steer (*classes will be divided as entries warrant*)

DIVISION 15: MARKET HOG

REGULATIONS:

1. **Hogs must have been born on or after January 1, 2018.**
2. **Ownership date for hogs is May 1 of current year. (see rule #17)**
3. **Minimum show/sale weight 210 pounds.** Maximum sale weight for market swine is 290 pounds. Hogs weighing over will sell at 290 weight.
4. Gilts or barrows are eligible.
5. Hog classes will be broken according to check-in weight regardless of breed. Hogs will show lightest to heaviest and class breaks will be posted prior to show. The weights will be available to the judge.
6. Montana State Fair reserves the right to weigh back any hog immediately following exhibition. A variance of less than five percent difference from the weigh-in weight is recommended. A variance of more than five percent may result in disqualification.
7. Montana State Fair reserves the right to collect saliva, urine, blood sample, etc. on any animal for testing of forbidden drugs or medication.

DIVISION 16: MARKET LAMB

REGULATIONS:

1. **Lambs must have been born on or after January 1, 2018.**
2. **Ownership date for lambs is May 1 of current year. (see rule #17)**
3. **Minimum show/sale weight is 110 pounds.** Maximum sale weight for market lambs is 175 pounds. Lambs weighing over will sell at 175 weight.
4. Ewe or wether lambs are eligible.
5. Lamb classes will be broken according to check-in weight regardless of breed. Lamb classes will be broke lightest to heaviest and class breaks will be posted prior to show. The weights will be available to the judge.

6. Montana State Fair reserves the right to weigh back any lamb immediately following exhibition. A variance of less than five percent difference from the weigh-in weight is recommended. A variance of more than five percent may result in disqualification.
7. Montana State Fair reserves the right to collect saliva, urine, blood sample, etc. on any animal for testing of forbidden drugs or medication.

DIVISION 17: MARKET GOAT

REGULATIONS:

1. **Goats must have been born on or after December 1, 2017.**
2. **Ownership date for goats is May 1 of current year. (see rule #17)**
3. **There must be 10 goats entered by July 15 in order for show to take place.**
4. **Minimum show/sale weight 50 pounds.** Maximum sale weight for market goats is 160 pounds. Goats weighing over will sell at 160 weight.
5. Does or wether kids are eligible.
6. Goat classes will be broken according to check-in weight regardless of breed. Goats will be broke lightest to heaviest and class breaks will be posted prior to show. The weights will be available to the judge.
7. Montana State Fair reserves the right to weigh back any goat immediately following exhibition. A variance of less than five percent difference from the weigh-in weight is recommended. A variance of more than five percent may result in disqualification.
8. Montana State Fair reserves the right to collect saliva, urine, blood sample, etc. on any animal for testing of forbidden drugs or medication.

DIVISION 18: SHOWMANSHIP

REGULATIONS:

1. Showmanship will have two divisions. Exhibitors will be broke into an appropriate division according to their age as of January 1 of the current year.
2. Pre-entry is required.
3. Senior exhibitors will show first in each species division followed juniors. Class breaks will be determined by random draw during the exhibitor meeting.
4. **All showmanship exhibitors will be required to show their own animals.**
